## 2. Information from the Chairperson

The online employer panel meetings for Media Technology programs are planned for Friday, May 23<sup>rd,</sup> 2025. We have arranged meetings for the programs in Medialogy (both BSc and MSc in AAL and CPH), Artificial Intelligence Engineering (DAKI), Lighting Design (LID) and Service System Design (SSD). It is a bit awkward to have the meetings for LID and SSD programs as they are scheduled for closure, but if we have students in the "pipeline", it is mandatory to have these meetings. There is a plan to invent new EVU programs in the LID and SSD areas and will be debated at the meetings.

In the other programs we will look at proper progression in the study plans. Another topic will be the exchange agreements that we have or could have. ## 7. Self-reported reasons for leaving the study program (2020-2024)

The study board discussed the data with the following comments:

- The number of students who have left the studies due to the self-reported reason "the content of the education did not meet my expectations", has dropped since 2020, which indicates a positive development.
- It is important that the online description of the study matches the content of the education
- Perhaps the name Medialogy is misleading
- Some students might have the impression that the study is about games
- There has been critique of some of the teachers from the students.

The study board has investigated the numbers and will continue to monitor them.

CBM will investigate the topic made about the critique of certain lecturers.



#### 8. Group size policy, debate

The Study Board discussed the group size policy with the following comments:

- o BSc: The Study Board argues for a cap of 4-5 students.
- o MSc: The Study Board has no comments about the group size.
- It is good with clarification regarding lesser supervision in smaller groups and regarding group rooms

The Study Board sees several advantages in having a limitation of 4-5 members for project groups in the B.Sc. semester (in no particular order):

- 1. With this limitation, it becomes possible in a "natural" and predictable way to break up well-established groups. Groups that have worked together for several semesters with the same composition of six people will be told in advance that the B.Sc. semester has a lower group size limit, making it natural for them to split up—perhaps even before the B.Sc. semester begins.
- 2. The Study Board believes that for learning purposes and "personal growth," groups from the B.Sc. semester and beyond, including at the master's level, should not be too large. The board considers groups of 2-4 members to be an appropriate size. In practice, this is also the de facto group size throughout the master's program. There are exceptions where groups are smaller or larger, but an official limit of six members at the master's level is not seen as problematic, as groups of that size are rarely formed.
- 3. The Study Board finds that large groups provide too much opportunity for certain students to hide. Additionally, there are concerns about whether grading in the project exams can be sufficiently precise and well-founded if groups consist of six members.

Overall, the Study Board argues for groups smaller than six members, ideally with a maximum of four members. A limitation of 4-5 members at the B.Sc. semester has previously contributed constructively to keep group sizes down and break up tightly knit groups.

## 9. Evaluation of Study Activities, Fall 2024 (1 report)

The study board had the following comments for MED1C:

- Response rate 77%
- Grade statistics are fine
- The semester generally worked well. There are some comments related to IKDU. The Study Board encourages the semester coordinator to investigate how IKDU can be changed to address some of the challenges.

Regarding project hand-in-time, it will normally also be 4 weeks before the deadline. But it might differ depending on the case. It can be Force majeure, or it can be a documented reason. Perhaps a medical document.
