1. Approval of agenda and minutes from the last meeting

CBM informed that he had attended a meeting about slowly starting up the process on how to do these new 75 ECTS educations. It is probably not going to affect the student members present on the Study Board. But at some time, the 120 ECTS Master programs will be changed into 75 ECTS. The program will be finished within 1 year. From September 1st to August 31st, the following year. It is interesting to see how it will be managed with administrative tasks. We will be designing new study plans next year in this format.

The Study Board secretariat attended a meeting where the 6th semester (Internship) on Artificial Intelligence Engineering was debated. It was noted that the exam format for this semester could benefit with another exam type as it is handled this way on other programs. From the beginning the exam format was *oral based on a project*, but the program responsible and the secretariat suggests that it should be changed to *written exam*. It will then be the semester coordinator that handles the Internship reports from the students. The first students will go into an Internship in Spring 2026, so we must apply for it before February 1st, 2026. The grade is pass/fail.

It was approved by the Study Board.

5. Overview of student withdrawing from their studies, 2021-2025

Quality and Analysis has extracted the number of students who have left their studies and their self-reported reasons for leaving over a 5 - year period from 2021- 2025.

The Study Board discussed the data with the following comments:

There is a total of 11 students that have left their studies during the first half of 2025, and a total of 190 students left the study over the 5 - year period 2021-2025. The reasons for leaving are self-reported by the students from a drop-down list. There do not seem to be any clear tendencies or systematic reasons behind the reasons given, as many different reasons have been chosen.

However, the reason "the program did not live up to my expectations have been mentioned 4 times in the spring 2025 drop out, and 31 times in the reasons for dropout the last 5 years. This indicates that it is difficult to convey the actual content of the education clearly enough. CBM encouraged the students in the Study Board to look at the AAU homepage with the knowledge they have now about the study and sent comments back to the study board.

6. Mapping of Medialogy graduates's employment based on LinkedIn

The employability ambassador has made a report regarding employability for Medialogy. The analysis was created to provide future and current Medialogy students with an in-depth insight into career paths that have historically led to successful employment. The goal is to better equip students to navigate the job market and thereby reduce the unemployment often experienced by new graduates.

The Study Board discussed the report with the following comments regarding the main findings (pg13):

The gender ratio is not easy to do much about. The ratio seems to be getting better on bachelor level, and an effort is made to make any study groups gender diverse, and make sure that women are not on their own in a group of male students.

The very large companies hire less graduates, so the job market is shifting.

It is surprising that 6 companies hire 2/3 of the graduates – Netcompany being a big player for first jobs, and AAU also employs many (as research assistants, teaching assistants etc.)



The issue that jobs do not always offer all you dreamt of is common for all MT educations. The dream job vs. reality is both a student and an educator problem. Educators and students must adjust their mindset, so that e.g. project proposals also reflect the real job market and future jobs.

LID has received a similar report, which has not yet been communicated much to the students. It is suggested that FLP could organize a meeting with students and coordinators where he presents the data – this should serve as a basis for a following dialogue between educators and students regarding e.g. project proposals.
