The first month

In the first week, you will be assigned to your study group. You will remain in this study group for the first semester, where you are going to help each other throughout the courses and project work.

In the first semester, every study group will have a tutor, who will make sure that you and your study group will have a good start at the first semester. They will also guide you in how to write a project and how to manage your daily tasks.

Do not hesitate to ask your tutor about anything... They're here to help!

If you are questioning whether it is important to participate in the many activities in the first month, the recommendation is yes. You should participate as much as possible.

Even though you have to study full time from the start, there will still be room for you to participate in all the cool events that's planned for you!

Who helps me along the way?

It is not only the tutors who will help you.

Study Secretaries:

The study secretaries are the primary point of contact for navigating the administrative aspects of your academic journey, such as course registration, exams and handling essential paperwork.

If you have any inquiries – such as questions about textbooks, class schedules, or study-related activities – the study secretaries are available to provide the answers. Their role is to ensure your transition into university life is as smooth as possible, helping you manage the practicalities so you can focus on your studies.

Remember, no question is too small or insignificant. If there's something you're unsure about, don't hesitate to reach out.

Student counsellor:

Heidi is the student counsellor, who is available to address both academic and personal concerns. She is the person you can approach to talk about your well-being, any uncertainties about your studies or the choices you can take during your educational journey.

Her role involves providing guidance, support and resources to help you during your time at the university. She can introduce you to a variety of study techniques and assist you in enhancing your study skills.

Heidi can also help you with significant decisions such as changing your programme or selecting your Master's degree. If the dynamics of your group become challenging, she can work with you on improvement of the collaboration between group members.

Don't hesitate to reach out to her whenever you need assistance.

AAU Mail
